

I think that summer is here – finally!

We are still taking orders for the 30th anniversary club coins. The new extended deadline for placing orders is now June 30th.

The annual summer picnic will be on July 14th. The main event is the donation auction. The club is taking donations for the auction, which can be dropped off at Carl's Jewelers at the University Center, or given to one of the board members.

Also, the raffle item for the picnic is a U.S. 1926-P \$2 ½ Gold Indian graded AU/BU. You can start buying raffle tickets for this coin at our upcoming June 5th meeting.

- The monthly raffle item, an **1862 \$100 Confederate Note graded AU**, being raffled off that evening with raffle tickets at \$5/ticket, 5 tickets/\$20, or 11 tickets/\$40.
- Presentation on the subject of **"The History of Coinage- Part One- Its Beginnings"** that evening by **Larry Nakata**.
- On the matter of the club's trailer, until we can find a permanent storage location...we will be storing the trailer at a commercial rental location that will cost our club \$59 per month. We are still looking for a better location to store the trailer. The trailer presently stores our club tables, chairs, and coin cases. If any member has a better location in mind, get with President Dan Barnhart.

- On the matter of club dues, a letter was sent to club members who were delinquent in dues asking them to just pay for this year's dues to keep current. As of this past month's newsletter, members who did not respond had their newsletters discontinued. President Dan Barnhart then emphasized to the membership the importance of paying yearly dues and the benefits that a club member gets from those dues besides the newsletter.
- **Our club's summer picnic will be on Saturday, July 14th to be held at the Abbott Community Park located on Elmore Road/ Anchorage. We plan to have food, games, and our annual Summer Coin Donation Auction held that day. We are accepting coin and numismatic donations at this time for the club's summer picnic/meeting auction.**

Update given on the club's 30th Anniversary Coins and Sets:

- The order sheet for our club's 30th Anniversary coins and sets was put into the last newsletter. The order sheet will also be printed into our next newsletter as well.
- We have been taking in orders since last month.
- Extra order sheets will also be available at our club meetings in May and June. We are asking our members to fill out the order sheets and mail them to our club's address (**ACC/ PO Box 230169/ Anchorage, AK 99523-0169**) or turn them in at our club meetings. Order sheets can also be dropped off at Carl's place of business (located at the University Center in Anchorage).
- Optimally, we would like to have all orders placed by June 5th (**Note: At our Board meeting on May 16th, Board elected to have placement of orders extended to end of June (June 30th) to allow members sufficient time to place orders.** Payment on orders will be required later in the month of June. Larry Nakata will be tracking all of the orders.

- The plan is to have all coins and sets ready by our club's summer picnic meeting on Saturday, July 14th.
- We will be placing only one order for all of the coins and sets with the Alaska Mint.....otherwise we will be charged a \$150 setup fee anytime we place additional orders.
- Following mintage of the 30th Anniversary coins and sets, the club will be in possession of the 30th Anniversary die, which will be added to the 5th, 10th, 15th, 20th, and 25th Anniversary dies that the club presently possesses.

The club's Board members will be meeting at the **"907 Ale House Restaurant"** located at 8001 Old Seward Highway on May 16th (3rd Wed of this month) at 6:30 pm. Members are welcomed to attend the Board meeting.

Larry Nakata then gave his presentation on the subject of ***"The History of Coinage- Part One- Its Beginnings"***.

Recap of the May 16th Anchorage Coin Club Board Meeting

The Anchorage Coin Club meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Club President **Dan Barnhart**. Board meeting held at **907 Ale House Restaurant** in Anchorage.

Following distribution of correspondence, Treasurer **John Larson** gave the monthly update on the club finances. Board deemed finances in good shape.

Update on the club's 30th Anniversary coin set:

Larry Nakata stated that as of the Board meeting, there were 17 orders for coin sets and coins totaling \$1695 in orders. Larry brought up the point that having everyone place orders with a deadline of June 5th is too tight. Larry reminded the Board

that the sets/coins are planned to be ready by our club's summer picnic event on July 14th, which should allow more time for our members to place orders. The Board accordingly decided to extend the deadline to June 30th. This should still allow time to have the coins/sets minted for the club's July 14th summer picnic/meeting event.

The Board then discussed plans for our upcoming summer picnic meeting on Saturday July 14th at the Abbott Community Park located on Elmore Road in Anchorage.

- Our club's next main event will be our summer picnic on Saturday, July 14th at the Abbott Community Park Pavilion located on Elmore St. in Anchorage. This location has traditionally been where our club conducts its summer picnic event. Like years past, it will be potluck event with the club providing the hamburgers, hotdogs, chips, dips, soda pop, plates, forks, spoons, knives, and utensils. Members are asked to bring desserts, salads, and side dishes to augment the food provided.
- **If your last name starts with the letters A-H bring a salad.**
- **If your last name starts with the letters I-P, bring a side dish.**
- **If your last name starts with the letters Q-Z, bring a dessert.**
- The summer picnic event starts at 12 noon at the pavilion and usually ends up around 3 to 3:30 in the afternoon. There are games that the members and their family can participate.
- **The main event will be our club's annual summer donation auction. Members are asked to donate coins and numismatic items that can be auctioned off at the July 14th Summer picnic event. Proceeds from the auction are used to fund our club's programs. Members can donate these items at our June 5th club meeting....drop them off at Carl's (University Center)....or bring items to the July 14th Summer picnic event.**
- As in years past, **our July 14th Summer picnic will be our official membership meeting date for the month of July.** Accordingly.....members are reminded **NOT** to show up at Central Lutheran Church on the first Tuesday of July (July 3rd).

Other issues discussed:

- Dan Barnhart: We are now paying \$59/month with Arctic Storage until such time as we can find a better location for the club's trailer. Discussed were other alternatives....with the conclusion that for now, pay the \$59/month fee in a location with easy access and good security for the club's trailer.
- Policy and Procedure Manual. Dan Barnhart reinforced that point to have a draft manual accomplished by our club's next election month (March 2019).
- Replacement of our club's outdoor signs used for our coin shows. The next coin show will be in October coinciding with the release of the Alaska Permanent Fund. Board agreed that we need to replace those signs by this timeframe. Mike McKinnon and Bill Rodeck are working on design of an outdoor sign that can be anchored down more securely so that they cannot be stolen. They will get back with the Board on costs.

For the club's June 5th membership meeting:

- The monthly raffle item will be an ***1888-P Morgan Dollar graded ANACS MS-61.*** There will also be a second prize, an ***1895-P Morgan Dollar graded Good.*** Tickets will be available that evening at \$5/each, 5 tickets for \$20, or 11 tickets for \$40.



- Refreshments will be potluck with club members asked to bring refreshment items for the meeting. The club will provide the soda pop and chips.

The next club Board meeting to be held at **"Guido's Pizza"** located at 549 W. International Airport Road in Anchorage on June 20th at 6:30 PM.


